Psalm 104:5-9

(Psalm 104:5) You set the earth on its foundations, so that it shall never be shaken.

(Psalm 104:6) You cover it with the deep as with a garment; the waters stood above the mountains.

(Psalm 104:7) At your rebuke they flee; at the sound of your thunder they take to flight.

(Psalm 104:8) They rose up to the mountains, ran down to the valleys to the place that you appointed for them.

(Psalm 104:9) You set a boundary that they may not pass, so that they might not again cover the earth.

Psalm 104:24-30

(Psalm 104:24) O LORD, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

(Psalm 104:25) Yonder is the sea, great and wide, creeping things innumerable are there, living things both small and great.

(Psalm 104:26) There go the ships, and Leviathan that you formed to sport in it.

(Psalm 104:27) These all look to you to give them their food in due season;

(Psalm 104:28) when you give to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are filled with good things.

(Psalm 104:29) When you hide your face, they are dismayed; when you take away their breath, they die and return to their dust.

(Psalm 104:30) When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground.
