Psalms 95:1-11

(Psalms 95:1) Oh come, let us sing to the LORD; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!

(Psalms 95:2) Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!

(Psalms 95:3) For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods.

(Psalms 95:4) In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also.

(Psalms 95:5) The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land.

(Psalms 95:6) Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker!

(Psalms 95:7) For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand. Today, if you hear his voice,

(Psalms 95:8) do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah, as on the day at Massah in the wilderness,

(Psalms 95:9) when your fathers put me to the test and put me to the proof, though they had seen my work.

(Psalms 95:10) For forty years I loathed that generation and said, "They are a people who go astray in their heart, and they have not known my ways."

(Psalms 95:11) Therefore I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."
