Psalms 104:1-4 & 24-30

(Psalms 104:1) Praise the LORD, my soul. LORD my God, you are very great; you are clothed with splendor and majesty.

(Psalms 104:2) The LORD wraps himself in light as with a garment; he stretches out the heavens like a tent

(Psalms 104:3) and lays the beams of his upper chambers on their waters. He makes the clouds his chariot and rides on the wings of the wind.

(Psalms 104:4) He makes winds his messengers, flames of fire his servants.

(Psalms 104:24) How many are your works, LORD! In wisdom you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

(Psalms 104:25) There is the sea, vast and spacious, teeming with creatures beyond number-- living things both large and small.

(Psalms 104:26) There the ships go to and fro, and Leviathan, which you formed to frolic there.

(Psalms 104:27) All creatures look to you to give them their food at the proper time.

(Psalms 104:28) When you give it to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are satisfied with good things.

(Psalms 104:29) When you hide your face, they are terrified; when you take away their breath, they die and return to the dust.

(Psalms 104:30) When you send your Spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the ground.
