Psalms 148:1-14

(Psalms 148:1) Praise the LORD. Praise the LORD from the heavens; praise him in the heights above.

(Psalms 148:2) Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his heavenly hosts.

(Psalms 148:3) Praise him, sun and moon; praise him, all you shining stars.

(Psalms 148:4) Praise him, you highest heavens and you waters above the skies.

(Psalms 148:5) Let them praise the name of the LORD, for at his command they were created,

(Psalms 148:6) and he established them for ever and ever—he issued a decree that will never pass away.

(Psalms 148:7) Praise the LORD from the earth, you great sea creatures and all ocean depths,

(Psalms 148:8) lightning and hail, snow and clouds, stormy winds that do his bidding,

(Psalms 148:9) you mountains and all hills, fruit trees and all cedars,

(Psalms 148:10) wild animals and all cattle, small creatures and flying birds,

(Psalms 148:11) kings of the earth and all nations, you princes and all rulers on earth,

(Psalms 148:12) young men and women, old men and children.

(Psalms 148:13) Let them praise the name of the LORD, for his name alone is exalted; his splendor is above the earth and the heavens.

(Psalms 148:14) And he has raised up for his people a horn, the praise of all his faithful servants, of Israel, the people close to his heart. Praise the LORD.
