Psalms 104:1-4 & 24-30

(Psalms 104:1) Bless the LORD, O my soul. O LORD my God, you are very great. You are clothed with honor and majesty,

(Psalms 104:2) wrapped in light as with a garment. You stretch out the heavens like a tent,

(Psalms 104:3) you set the beams of your chambers on the waters, you make the clouds your chariot, you ride on the wings of the wind,

(Psalms 104:4) you make the winds your messengers, fire and flame your ministers.

(Psalms 104:24) O LORD, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

(Psalms 104:25) Yonder is the sea, great and wide, creeping things innumerable are there, living things both small and great.

(Psalms 104:26) There go the ships, and Leviathan that you formed to sport in it.

(Psalms 104:27) These all look to you to give them their food in due season;

(Psalms 104:28) when you give to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are filled with good things.

(Psalms 104:29) When you hide your face, they are dismayed; when you take away their breath, they die and return to their dust.

(Psalms 104:30) When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground.
