Study Guide on Matthew 12:1-14 New International Version

Assign each person in the class one or more verses to study. Each person should answer these two questions on their assigned verse.

- 1. What does this verse say?
- 2. What does this verse mean to me?
- 3. Discuss your answers with the class.

(Matthew 12:1) At that time Jesus went through the grainfields on the Sabbath. His disciples were hungry and began to pick some heads of grain and eat them.

(Matthew 12:2) When the Pharisees saw this, they said to him, "Look! Your disciples are doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath."

(Matthew 12:3) He answered, "Haven't you read what David did when he and his companions were hungry?

(Matthew 12:4) He entered the house of God, and he and his companions ate the consecrated bread—which was not lawful for them to do, but only for the priests.

(Matthew 12:5) Or haven't you read in the Law that the priests on Sabbath duty in the temple desecrate the Sabbath and yet are innocent?

(Matthew 12:6) I tell you that something greater than the temple is here.

(Matthew 12:7) If you had known what these words mean, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the innocent.

(Matthew 12:8) For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath."

(Matthew 12:9) Going on from that place, he went into their synagogue,

(Matthew 12:10) and a man with a shriveled hand was there. Looking for a reason to bring charges against Jesus, they asked him, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"

(Matthew 12:11) He said to them, "If any of you has a sheep and it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will you not take hold of it and lift it out?

(Matthew 12:12) How much more valuable is a person than a sheep! Therefore it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath."

(Matthew 12:13) Then he said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." So he stretched it out and it was completely restored, just as sound as the other.

(Matthew 12:14) But the Pharisees went out and plotted how they might kill Jesus.
