(Psalms 103:1) Of David. Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name!

(Psalms 103:2) Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits,

(Psalms 103:3) who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases,

(Psalms 103:4) who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,

(Psalms 103:5) who satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

(Psalms 103:6) The LORD works righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed.

(Psalms 103:7) He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel.

(Psalms 103:8) The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

(Psalms 103:9) He will not always chide, nor will he keep his anger forever.

(Psalms 103:10) He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities.

(Psalms 103:11) For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him;

(Psalms 103:12) as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

(Psalms 103:13) As a father shows compassion to his children, so the LORD shows compassion to those who fear him.

(Psalms 103:14) For he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust.

(Psalms 103:15) As for man, his days are like grass; he flourishes like a flower of the field;

(Psalms 103:16) for the wind passes over it, and it is gone, and its place knows it no more.

(Psalms 103:17) But the steadfast love of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear him, and his righteousness to children's children,

(Psalms 103:18) to those who keep his covenant and remember to do his commandments.

(Psalms 103:19) The LORD has established his throne in the heavens, and his kingdom rules over all.

(Psalms 103:20) Bless the LORD, O you his angels, you mighty ones who do his word, obeying the voice of his word!

(Psalms 103:21) Bless the LORD, all his hosts, his ministers, who do his will!

(Psalms 103:22) Bless the LORD, all his works, in all places of his dominion. Bless the LORD, O my soul!
