(Psalms 48:1) A song. A psalm of the Sons of Korah. Great is the LORD, and most worthy of praise, in the city of our God, his holy mountain.

(Psalms 48:3) God is in her citadels; he has shown himself to be her fortress.

(Psalms 48:4) When the kings joined forces, when they advanced together,

(Psalms 48:6) Trembling seized them there, pain like that of a woman in labor.

(Psalms 48:7) You destroyed them like ships of Tarshish shattered by an east wind.

(Psalms 48:13) consider well her ramparts, view her citadels, that you may tell of them to the next generation.
