(Psalms 48:6) trembling took hold of them there, pains as of a woman in labor,

(Psalms 48:7) as when an east wind shatters the ships of Tarshish.

(Psalms 48:8) As we have heard, so have we seen in the city of the LORD of hosts, in the city of our God, which God establishes forever. [Selah]

(Psalms 48:9) We ponder your steadfast love, O God, in the midst of your temple.

(Psalms 48:10) Your name, O God, like your praise, reaches to the ends of the earth. Your right hand is filled with victory.

(Psalms 48:11) Let Mount Zion be glad, let the towns of Judah rejoice because of your judgments.

(Psalms 48:12) Walk about Zion, go all around it, count its towers,

(Psalms 48:13) consider well its ramparts; go through its citadels, that you may tell the next generation

(Psalms 48:14) that this is God, our God forever and ever. He will be our guide forever.
