## Psalms 91:1-16 International Bible Lesson Study Guide New Revised Standard Version

(Psalms 91:1) You who live in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shadow of the Almighty,

(Psalms 91:2) will say to the LORD, "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust."

(Psalms 91:3) For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence;

(Psalms 91:4) he will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness is a shield and buckler.

(Psalms 91:5) You will not fear the terror of the night, or the arrow that flies by day,

(Psalms 91:6) or the pestilence that stalks in darkness, or the destruction that wastes at noonday.

(Psalms 91:7) A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you.

(Psalms 91:8) You will only look with your eyes and see the punishment of the wicked.

(Psalms 91:9) Because you have made the LORD your refuge, the Most High your dwelling place,

(Psalms 91:10) no evil shall befall you, no scourge come near your tent.

(Psalms 91:11) For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways.

(Psalms 91:12) On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone.

(Psalms 91:13) You will tread on the lion and the adder, the young lion and the serpent you will trample under foot.

(Psalms 91:14) Those who love me, I will deliver; I will protect those who know my name.

(Psalms 91:15) When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble, I will rescue them and honor them.

(Psalms 91:16) With long life I will satisfy them, and show them my salvation.
