## Why Do Some People Abandon God?

## International Bible Lessons Judges 10:10-18

"Yet you have abandoned me and worshiped other gods; therefore I will deliver you no more" (Judges 10:13—NRSV).

"Yet you have forsaken me and served other gods; therefore I will save you no more" (Judges10:13—ESV).

"Yet ye have forsaken me, and served other gods: wherefore I will deliver you no more" (Judges 10:13—KJV).

These words of God may be some of the saddest words to hear from His heart. How sad to learn that after God has done so much for someone (or for a church, a people, a nation) that they have abandoned God, the ultimate source of all true happiness. To add insult to injury, some have then turned to other gods, embracing the temporary pleasures and false promises that the servants of these false gods offered them. Yet, the Book of Judges teaches that God accused His chosen people, the Israelites, of repeatedly committing these heartbreaking sins.

To those who once trusted in God, but have turned from Him, these words of God might bring despair in troubled times: "I will deliver you no more." How sad to learn that sometimes God must allow someone to suffer the unhappy consequences of their choice to abandon God and live contrary to His ways. In essence, the Apostle Paul also emphasized this fact about what can happen to those who turn from faith in God: "And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind and to things that should not be done" (Romans 1:28).

When the Israelites finally cried out to God in their suffering, God replied, "Go and cry to the gods whom you have chosen; let them deliver you in the time of your distress" (Judges 10:14). However, their false gods had no power to help them and their suffering increased. Nevertheless, whenever they turned back to the Lord and worshiped Him, God raised up leaders who obeyed Him and delivered His people from oppression.
