Lord Jesus, in a variety of different ways some people think it is evil to serve You as Lord and Savior, to trust in our Heavenly Father, to follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and to believe the Bible is true. Please give us the wisdom and might we need so we are not intimidated and cave to the pressures they try to place upon us. Help us always to serve You and others with compassion, kindness, and wisdom. Help those who do not know You come to know and love the one true God. In Your Name we pray. Amen.
