Psalms 91:1-16 International Bible Lesson Applications

- 1. The psalmist is speaking *in general* about those who truly trust in God. They will be saved from many dangers and evils in this life, but certainly not from them all. They will be saved from all evils in the life to come.
- 2. In this world, believers will face many dangers and experience suffering. Consider Jesus and the twelve apostles. But believers are also saved from many evils from time to time. Consider Peter, angels freed him from prison. Consider Paul, he was rescued from the lion's mouth.
- 3. No matter what we might suffer physically, when we remain under God's protection and make God our refuge and fortress, His faithfulness will always shield us spiritually and enable us to keep praising God.
- 4. After Jesus returns, a little child will be able to lead a wolf, a leopard, a lion, a goat, and a calf (Isaiah 11:6 & 65:25). What the psalmist hoped for in Psalm 91 will be fulfilled someday without any exceptions.
- 5. We need to hold fast to God in love, for He will answer our prayers and meet all our needs in ways that are the very best for us.
