We love You for all the love, goodness, and mercy that You have shown us. Thank You for calling twelve men to learn from You and of You as the King of kings, as the promised Messiah, as our Lord and Savior. Thank You for leading and teaching Your apostles Your ways so they could carry on Your work faithfully after You ascended into heaven. Thank You for preparing and calling them to serve as Your apostles, as Your ambassadors, as Your representatives on the earth. Thank You for insuring that what You and they taught on earth was faithfully preserved in the Bible for us to study and teach others. Thank You for showing us how Church leaders should be carefully trained and prepared before they are set apart by the Church to represent You and Your teachings in a world that so desperately needs to be set free from deception, evil, and sin. You have shown how Your gospel and Your Spirit can transform ordinary men and women with a variety of backgrounds into Christians who can work together in love for You and one another; so, we pray that You would transform us into Your image and give us work to do from hearts of love. As we study the Bible, we pray that we too will know the life-transforming truths and way of life that You shared with all those You met on earth. We pray that Your Spirit would make Biblical truths and a Biblical way of life real to us as we seek to obey all that You are teaching us. Please increase our faith in and love for You each day. Empower us to love others and show others how much You love them by the way we speak and live as Your followers. In Your Name we pray. Amen.
