We depend totally on You, so please help us live a morally and spiritually blessed life that flows from developing the Christian qualities that You described. Please help us better understand Your Word written and better apply what we are learning as the Holy Spirit guides and empowers us. Indeed, we cannot do anything of value apart from You. We confess our total dependence on You for all things, and we truly want to love You and live with You forever in the kingdom of heaven. Thank You for comforting us when we mourn over our past sins, and especially when we knew better but sinned again and failed You and ourselves. Please help us control ourselves when we are tempted. Please help us humbly help others when they do what offends You, others, and us. Indeed, by our maintaining self-control in dependence on You, we can be prepared to inherit the earth and treat others as You would have them treated. Lord Jesus, we do hunger and thirst for everything and everyone to be made right by You so we can truly love one another and be filled with Your righteousness. Knowing ourselves, our sins, and Your mercy, please help us show mercy and forgiveness to those who have sinned against us. We all need Your grace and mercy, and we pray that You will help us show Your grace and mercy to others, especially when we share the good news about You. Please help many more come to know the will of God and pray that the will of God would be done on earth as it is in heaven. Help us seek to know Your will to do Your will, and help us be peacemakers whenever we are persecuted for our faith in You. In Your Name we pray. Amen.

You might like to close your class with the above prayer as a way of beginning to teach your class how they too can pray through the Bible. First, you might like to teach your class how to pray through the *International Bible Lessons* each week.
