Matthew 5:43-48

(Matthew 5:43) “You have heard that it was said, ‘You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.’

(Matthew 5:44) But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,

(Matthew 5:45) so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous.

(Matthew 5:46) For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same?

(Matthew 5:47) And if you greet only your brothers and sisters, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same?

(Matthew 5:48) Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.”
