Habakkuk 2:1-5; 3:17-19

(Habakkuk 2:1) I will stand on my guard post And station myself on the rampart;
And I will keep watch to see what He will speak to me, And how I may reply when
I am reproved.

(Habakkuk 2:2) Then the LORD answered me and said, "Record the vision And
inscribe *it* on tablets, That the one who reads it may run.

(Habakkuk 2:3) "For the vision is yet for the appointed time; It hastens toward
the goal and it will not fail. Though it tarries, wait for it; For it will certainly come,
it will not delay.

(Habakkuk 2:4) "Behold, as for the proud one, His soul is not right within him;
But the righteous will live by his faith.

(Habakkuk 2:5) "Furthermore, wine betrays the haughty man, So that he does
not stay at home. He enlarges his appetite like Sheol, And he is like death, never
satisfied. He also gathers to himself all nations And collects to himself all peoples.

(Habakkuk 3:17) Though the fig tree should not blossom And there be no fruit on
the vines, *Though* the yield of the olive should fail And the fields produce no food,
Though the flock should be cut off from the fold And there be no cattle in the
stalls,

(Habakkuk 3:18) Yet I will exult in the LORD, I will rejoice in the God of my
salvation.

(Habakkuk 3:19) The Lord GOD is my strength, And He has made my feet like
hinds' *feet*, And makes me walk on my high places. For the choir director, on my
stringed instruments.
