### **Job 19:1-7, 23-29**

**(Job 19:1)** Then Job responded,

**(Job 19:2)** “How long will you torment me And crush me with words?

**(Job 19:3)** “These ten times you have insulted me; You are not ashamed to wrong me.

**(Job 19:4)** “Even if I have truly erred, My error lodges with me.

**(Job 19:5)** “If indeed you vaunt yourselves against me And prove my disgrace to me,

**(Job 19:6)** Know then that God has wronged me And has closed His net around me.

**(Job 19:7)** “Behold, I cry, ‘Violence!’ but I get no answer; I shout for help, but there is no justice.

**(Job 19:23)** “Oh that my words were written! Oh that they were inscribed in a book!

**(Job 19:24)** “That with an iron stylus and lead They were engraved in the rock forever!

**(Job 19:25)** “As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives, And at the last He will take His stand on the earth.

**(Job 19:26)** “Even after my skin is destroyed, Yet from my flesh I shall see God;

**(Job 19:27)** Whom I myself shall behold, And whom my eyes will see and not another. My heart faints within me!

**(Job 19:28)** “If you say, ‘How shall we persecute him?’ And ‘What pretext for a case against him can we find?’

(Job 19:29) “*Then* be afraid of the sword for yourselves, For wrath *brings* the punishment of the sword, So that you may know there is judgment.”
