Psalms 33:1-12

(Psalms 33:1) Sing for joy in the LORD, O you righteous ones; Praise is becoming to the upright.

(Psalms 33:2) Give thanks to the LORD with the lyre; Sing praises to Him with a harp of ten strings.

(Psalms 33:3) Sing to Him a new song; Play skillfully with a shout of joy.

(Psalms 33:4) For the word of the LORD is upright, And all His work is done in faithfulness.

(Psalms 33:5) He loves righteousness and justice; The earth is full of the lovingkindness of the LORD.

(Psalms 33:6) By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, And by the breath of His mouth all their host.

(Psalms 33:7) He gathers the waters of the sea together as a heap; He lays up the deeps in storehouses.

(Psalms 33:8) Let all the earth fear the LORD; Let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him.

(Psalms 33:9) For He spoke, and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast.

(Psalms 33:10) The LORD nullifies the counsel of the nations; He frustrates the plans of the peoples.

(Psalms 33:11) The counsel of the LORD stands forever, The plans of His heart from generation to generation.

(Psalms 33:12) Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, The people whom He has chosen for His own inheritance.
