Psalms 96:1-13

(Psalms 96:1) Sing to the LORD a new song; Sing to the LORD, all the earth.

(Psalms 96:2) Sing to the LORD, bless His name; Proclaim good tidings of His salvation from day to day.

(Psalms 96:3) Tell of His glory among the nations, His wonderful deeds among all the peoples.

(Psalms 96:4) For great is the LORD and greatly to be praised; He is to be feared above all gods.

(Psalms 96:5) For all the gods of the peoples are idols, But the LORD made the heavens.

(Psalms 96:6) Splendor and majesty are before Him, Strength and beauty are in His sanctuary.

(Psalms 96:7) Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, Ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.

(Psalms 96:8) Ascribe to the LORD the glory of His name; Bring an offering and come into His courts.

(Psalms 96:9) Worship the LORD in holy attire; Tremble before Him, all the earth.

(Psalms 96:10) Say among the nations, "The LORD reigns; Indeed, the world is firmly established, it will not be moved; He will judge the peoples with equity."

(Psalms 96:11) Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; Let the sea roar, and all it contains;

(Psalms 96:12) Let the field exult, and all that is in it. Then all the trees of the forest will sing for joy

(Psalms 96:13) Before the LORD, for He is coming, For He is coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness And the peoples in His faithfulness.
