John 6:35-46 Scripture Handout New Revised Standard Version

Assign each person in the class one or more verses to study.
Each person should answer these two questions on their assigned verse.

1. What does this verse say?
 2. What does this verse mean to me?
- Discuss your answers with the class.

(John 6:35) Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

(John 6:36) But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe.

(John 6:37) Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away;

(John 6:38) for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me.

(John 6:39) And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day.

(John 6:40) This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day.”

(John 6:41) Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, “I am the bread that came down from heaven.”

(John 6:42) They were saying, “Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, ‘I have come down from heaven?’”

(John 6:43) Jesus answered them, “Do not complain among yourselves.

(John 6:44) No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me; and I will raise that person up on the last day.

(John 6:45) It is written in the prophets, 'And they shall all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me.

(John 6:46) Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father."
