John 15:10-17 Scripture Handout New International Version

Assign each person in the class one or more verses to study.
Each person should answer these two questions on their assigned verse.

1. What does this verse say?
 2. What does this verse mean to me?
- Discuss your answers with the class.

(John 15:10) “If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father’s commands and remain in his love.

(John 15:11) I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.

(John 15:12) My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.

(John 15:13) Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.

(John 15:14) You are my friends if you do what I command.

(John 15:15) I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master’s business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.

(John 15:16) You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.”

(John 15:17) This is my command: Love each other.”
