Verse-by-Verse Bible Lessons Thru the Bible

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Joshua 2:8-13; 6:16-17 Scripture Handout New Revised Standard Version

Assign each person in the class one or more verses to study.

(Joshua 2:8) Before they went to sleep, she came up to them on the roof

(Joshua 2:9) and said to the men: "I know that the LORD has given you the land, and that dread of you has fallen on us, and that all the inhabitants of the land melt in fear before you.

(Joshua 2:10) For we have heard how the LORD dried up the water of the Red Sea before you when you came out of Egypt, and what you did to the two kings of the Amorites that were beyond the Jordan, to Sihon and Og, whom you utterly destroyed.

(Joshua 2:11) As soon as we heard it, our hearts melted, and there was no courage left in any of us because of you. The LORD your God is indeed God in heaven above and on earth below.

(Joshua 2:12) Now then, since I have dealt kindly with you, swear to me by the LORD that you in turn will deal kindly with my family. Give me a sign of good faith

(Joshua 2:13) that you will spare my father and mother, my brothers and sisters, and all who belong to them, and deliver our lives from death."

(Joshua 6:16) And at the seventh time, when the priests had blown the trumpets, Joshua said to the people, "Shout! For the LORD has given you the city.

(Joshua 6:17) The city and all that is in it shall be devoted to the LORD for destruction. Only Rahab the prostitute and all who are with her in her house shall live because she hid the messengers we sent.
