

What Does God Do For You?

“Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel: I am the LORD your God, who teaches you for your own good, who leads you in the way you should go” (Isaiah 48:17—NRSV).

“Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel, I am the LORD your God, who teaches you to profit, Who leads you in the way you should go.” (Isaiah 48:17—NASB-U).

“Thus saith the Lord, thy Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel; I am the Lord thy God which teacheth thee to profit, which leadeth thee by the way that thou shouldest go.” (Isaiah 48:17—KJV).

God maintains His moral purity and standards at all times; therefore, He will not permit people to keep on sinning without punishing them, or calling them to repent, or finding a way to save them from their sins. When the Jews continued to worship idols, consult demons, and trust in foreign nations to save them from their enemies, God finally punished them. The prophet Isaiah warned about God’s punishment when he called the people to repent, and when they refused, God brought about the destruction of Jerusalem and sent them into exile. After they learned their lesson, God redeemed them from exile in Babylon and called them home.

Isaiah also predicted the Messiah’s coming. About 500 years after the Jews returned from exile, God sent the Messiah to save from sin all those who trusted in Him. Jesus, the Redeemer Messiah, paid the high price of redemption by dying on a cross as a sacrifice for our sins; so, while maintaining absolute moral standards, God can justly forgive repentant sinners.

In addition, for our own good, God promises to teach those He has redeemed. When we study the Bible, the Holy Spirit helps us understand the meaning for the benefit of others and ourselves as we adjust our way of living. God does more for us than point the way through our reading the Bible. God leads us and prepares our path day by day. The Holy Spirit, who indwells every believer, helps us make decisions and gives us the strength to follow God wherever He leads. — © Copyright 2011 L.G. Parkhurst, Jr.

5. Read verse 22 again. In what ways do you find this verse to be true today? How might you explain the truths this verse reveals to someone who is constantly disobeying God and not following the teachings of the Bible?
