

## ***How Do You Know Who To Trust ?***

*“Then they will see ‘the Son of Man coming in clouds’ with great power and glory” (Mark 13:26—NRSV).*

*“Then they will see THE SON OF MAN COMING IN CLOUDS with great power and glory” (Mark 13:26—NASB-U).*

*“And then shall they see the Son of man coming in the clouds with great power and glory” (Mark 13:26—KJV).*

Jesus told His disciples exactly how He would return to earth after He rose from the dead and ascended into heaven. He even showed them what His second coming in the clouds would look like, for He would descend the way He ascended. Luke wrote that two angels asked His disciples, “Why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven” (see Acts 1:9-11). Knowing these facts, believers should not be misled by anyone who tries to attract followers by claiming to be the Messiah.

Jesus warned that prior to His return the times would be so troubled that if it were possible even those who followed Him and His teachings could be led astray. Deceivers would come and work signs and wonders to trap many in falsehood and disbelief. They would claim that their powers authenticated their teachings, even though

they contradicted the Bible's teachings. The Bible warns us to expect false prophets and teachers, and from these warnings we have learned to evaluate what people teach based on the Bible's absolute standards.

In the future, the times may bring such pain and uncertainty that many may follow anyone who seems to demonstrate the knowledge and power to meet their needs, whether rightly or wrongly. The Bible warns against following those who promise to meet people's physical needs while leading people away from trusting in the true God. Though troubles come, God has promised, "for the sake of the elect, whom he chose, he has cut short those days" (Mark 13:20).
