Praying Through Jeremiah 31:27-37

LORD God, we glorify and praise You for keeping Your promises to Your people as revealed in the Scriptures. Though we wait for some of Your promises to be completely fulfilled, You have fulfilled so many of them that we know You will fulfill them all. As Your people continue to know You better through the Bible, help us remember that You will forgive our wickedness and cease to remember our sins because of all that Jesus has achieved and will achieve for us. Indeed, we know these spiritual promises are true because of Your actions as promised and revealed in the Bible and fulfilled throughout human history. In Jesus' Name, we pray. Amen.
