Praying Through John 12:20-26

We seek to serve and follow Jesus according to His commands. We know His commands are for our good always. You might like to close your class with the above prayer as a way of beginning to teach your class how they too can pray through the Bible. Third, eventually, your students will be able to pray through the Bible without needing to write their prayer in advance before they pray at the end of class.
