John 21:20-25 Application

1. Think about what you might do differently or how you might live differently if you knew that you were “the disciple whom Jesus loved” and others thought you were “the disciple whom Jesus loved.” Discuss.
2. There are differences between denying Jesus, following Jesus, and betraying Jesus, and the consequences can be radically different.
3. We do not need to know some things about others and Jesus’ plans for others. It is none of our business.
4. We need to avoid comparing ourselves to other Christians, to the different gifts of other Christians, to how Jesus may lead others differently from us, or to think we are better or inferior to other Christians.
5. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus made certain that John’s Gospel, as a truthful testimony about what He said and did, eliminated rumors. What we learn about Jesus from the Bible is true. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we become Christians because we have learned and believe the truth.
