Romans 2:1-12 Scripture Handout

Each person should answer these two questions on their assigned verse.

1. What does this verse say?
 2. What does this verse mean to me?
- Discuss your answers with the class.

(Romans 2:1) Therefore you have no excuse, everyone of you who passes judgment, for in that which you judge another, you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things.

(Romans 2:2) And we know that the judgment of God rightly falls upon those who practice such things.

(Romans 2:3) But do you suppose this, O man, when you pass judgment on those who practice such things and do the same yourself, that you will escape the judgment of God?

(Romans 2:4) Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and tolerance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?

(Romans 2:5) But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up wrath for yourself in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God,

(Romans 2:6) who WILL RENDER TO EACH PERSON ACCORDING TO HIS DEEDS:

(Romans 2:7) to those who by perseverance in doing good seek for glory and honor and immortality, eternal life;

(Romans 2:8) but to those who are selfishly ambitious and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, wrath and indignation.

(Romans 2:9) There will be tribulation and distress for every soul of man who does evil, of the Jew first and also of the Greek,

(Romans 2:10) but glory and honor and peace to everyone who does good, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

(Romans 2:11) For there is no partiality with God.

(Romans 2:12) For all who have sinned without the Law will also perish without the Law, and all who have sinned under the Law will be judged by the Law;
